

**A new roof for  
Leckhampton C of E Primary  
School**

Time for new tiles after 104 years



The original 1905 tiles have done well, but some are damaged and others have started to crumble. The old horsehair backing under the tiles is past its use-by date too.



First, all the old tiles and insulation had to be removed.



Then, replacement tiles were laid. The new tiles vary slightly in colour so that the roof blends in with the original building.



The new roof looks wonderful – a real craftsman-built job. The tower has been renovated and painted.



A close-up of part of the new roof. The original 1905 ridge tiles have been reused to complete the effect, and it all blends in very well. Here is the view from the tower across to St Peter's spire in the middle distance.
